ST. PHILIP LUTHERAN CHURCH REGULAR MEETING OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL

April 9, 2024 Meeting Minutes

The Regular Meeting of the St. Philip Lutheran Church Council was held on Tuesday, April 9, 2024, in the Conference Room. The Meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Council President, Dave Witmer. A quorum was present to conduct business. Council Members present: Pastor Jason Lee, Dave Witmer, Susan McClelland, Linda Albert, Glen Stef, Ronda Anderson, Jackie Orcutt, Jim Siedel, and Shauna Shea. Others present: John Sparkman, Director of Music Ministry. Council Members not present: Roz Hanlon. Others not present: Jenn Loeswick, Preschool Director.

Opening Devotions and Discussion: Pastor Jason Lee offered personal reflection time and led group discussion about Baptism. What does Baptism do for us? While we are baptized out of sin/death/hell, we are also baptized into one body/spirit of Christ. Questions offered: How does the metaphor of the body of Christ help us understand our role in the Church? How are we reminded of our unity in Christ and caring for one another? Where are places and ways where we get to practically live this out?

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made by Glenn Stef and seconded by Jackie Orcutt to approve the Council Minutes dated March 12, 2024. Motion passed unanimously.

Approval of Special Called Congregational Meeting: Motion was made by Jim Seidel and seconded by Glenn Stef to approve the Minutes of the Special Called Congregational Meeting dated April 7, 2024. Motion passed unanimously.

Finance Reports: Reports were presented by Linda Albert for information purposes only and were accepted as presented. Committee Reports:

- Fellowship Committee Minutes given from April 8, 2024.
- Youth Committee presented by Pastor Jason Lee and Shauna Shea meeting next week (April 17). There was low
 participation in the Easter Egg Hunt, will re-evaluate event for next year. Upcoming events: Mini golf outing Sunday
 April 14 (11 confirmed presently) and youth serving at the April 27th homeless meal.
- Finance Committee presented by Glenn Stef currently working on cash flow projections and adjusting money market accounts.

Staff Reports:

John Sparkman, Director of Music Ministry

- Holy Week and Easter celebrations went wonderfully with much positive feedback.
- Planning ahead for the fall and winter season.
- Looking into ways to include the younger generation in services with musical offerings as kids choir continues to be a challenge.

Preschool update (reported by Pastor Jason Lee).

- Jenn is currently enrolled in the nature accreditation class and is finding it engaging and interesting.
- The online auction starts April 19 with many fun and interesting items up for bid.
- Looking ahead at the planned construction and trying to anticipate any needs/concerns/adjustments for the preschool (before/during/after).

Pastor's Report April 2024. Sign ups have been good for the End of Life Workshops. May will be very busy with final preparations for sabbatical.

Ratify Email Votes from the Month: A motion was made by Linda Albert and seconded by Glenn Steff (as recommended by the Finance Committee) that the present savings accounts at St. Philip Lutheran Church be transferred to a new Money Market Savings account and the funds in the Youth account and the Memorial account be transferred to a new Restrictive Accounts Money Market account. Motion passed unanimously.

Items for Discussion/Approval: New Altar placement will remain until the end of the Easter season. It worked very well and gives a good representation for height and visibility of proposed sanctuary renovations. There has not been any negative feedback.

St. Philip Annual Report for 2023 is completed.

Leadership Development: As sabbatical approaches quickly, plans are being finalized. Pastor Jason Lee and John Sparkman have upcoming meetings with Rev. Beth Neubauer. Pastor is working on compiling a list of his duties into categories (need to address, should address, and ok to wait) to help prioritize for council and Beth during his leave.



Sabbatical Interim Pastor

Over the past several months, we have been preparing for Pastor Jason's (and family) sabbatical this summer, June 1 through September 15, 2024.

In previous announcements, we have discussed what a sabbatical is and what it is not. A "sabbatical" is a significant amount of time away from ministry responsibilities and is to be used for both professional growth and personal renewal. It is not a vacation. There will be learning and growing that occurs, both for Pastor Jason and for the congregation of St. Philip.

We have shared the topic of his study over the summer. The question, "What would we need to change to integrate the next 50 people God wants to send us?" will guide his learning. Pastor Jason will be working with Pinnacle Leadership Associates to proactively navigate St. Philip's growth into the future. The ultimate goal of this learning is to, along with leadership at St. Philip, develop a church-specific size transition plan for the future health of St. Philip.

While away, we will have an Interim Pastor, Rev. Beth Neubauer, who will lead worship, provide pastoral care, and offer guidance and direction as needed.

As a member here at St. Philip, Pastor Neubauer is familiar with its history and culture, knows many faces and names, and is connected strongly to all of the ministries, projects, and renovations we aim to fulfill. While she will not be acting in a full-time role, Pastor Neubauer will be available in the office one day per week, as well as in case of emergency pastoral care needs.

We thank Pastor Neubauer for her willingness to serve and bless the congregation in this way. Please continue to pray for Pastor Jason, Pastor Beth, and St. Philip during this sabbatical time, that it may lead to renewal, revitalization, and preparedness for the future.

St. Philip Faith Stories

"Continuum" - Rev. Beth Neubauer

Ordained in 1976, Rev. Beth Neubauer spent many vacations at the Grand Stand, seeking respite from her ministerial duties. When she retired from full-time ministry in 2017, she eagerly embraced a new chapter, immediately relocating from Maryland to her new home in Carolina Forest, wanting to live that vacation lifestyle permanently. Yet, the shift to Myrtle Beach, with its new surroundings and new faces, initially left her feeling disconnected. The familiarity of her past life seemed distant in her newly retired state.



And so Beth sought to find something that connected her to her life before. That's when she discovered St. Philip Lutheran Church. "It is a place where I am fed in the pew," Beth explains. "The worship here is rooted in a strong liturgical tradition, emphasizing Word and sacrament, complemented by a mission of service and outreach."

At St. Philip, Beth has found more than just a connection; she encounters a faith that transcends her surroundings. Despite the newness of her environment, she felt an enduring presence of God. "There is a continuum of God's grace," Beth reflected. "I have been blessed wherever I've been, and I continue to feel that grace here."

Beth's connection with St. Philip continually reminds her of the broader communion of saints — those no longer on earth and those not in immediate proximity. "It's not merely about friendship," Beth remarks. "It's about support in times of need, sharing joy, and being enveloped in music and song. It's about community."

Beth's involvement extends beyond regular worship; through engaging in the church's outreach programs - including serving meals to the homeless and participating in Vacation Bible School - she has met people who have truly fleshed out the community. "It made me feel at home," she says.


