ST. PHILIP LUTHERAN CHURCH REGULAR MEETING OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL

March 12, 2024 Meeting Minutes

The Regular Meeting of the St. Philip Lutheran Church Council was held on Tuesday, March12, 2024, in the Conference Room. The Meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Council President, Dave Witmer. A quorum was present to conduct business.

Council Members present: Pastor Jason Lee, Dave Witmer, Linda Albert, Glen Stef, Ronda Anderson, Jackie Orcutt, Jim Siedel, Roz Hanlon, Shauna Shea. Others present: John Sparkman, Director of Music Ministry; Jenn Loeswick, Preschool Director. Council Members not present: Susan McClelland.

Opening Devotions and Discussion: Council watched the SC Synod video "Like Good Stewards" 2024 Mission Support Video. The video outlined and gave updates on current Synod missions, ministries, and partnerships. A discussion was held.

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made by Glenn Stef and seconded by Jim Seidel to approve the Council Minutes dated February 13, 2024. Motion passed unanimously.

Finance Reports: The reports were presented by Linda Albert for information purposes only and were accepted as presented.

Committee Reports: Music and Worship Committee Minutes from March 5, 2024. Outreach Committee Minutes from March 11, 2024. Youth Committee has the Easter Egg Hunt scheduled for Saturday March 23 at 2 p.m. Candy donations are needed as well as any willing volunteers. 2 events are planned for April, a mini golf outing and assisting at the April 27 Homeless Meal.

Staff Reports:

- Pastor reports the internet is now fixed (out since last Wednesday). The IT person was able to temporarily replace the
 access points, but new, updated hardware is being ordered. Holy Week schedule is set. End of Life Workshops with a
 variety of topics are scheduled for April. The SC Synod Assembly scheduled for June is online only. 2 delegates are
 needed. Anyone interested should let Pastor Jason know.
- John Sparkman, Director of Music Ministry, reports Music Ministry is in a very busy season right now. Plans for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday services with additional musicians and musical offerings are going well.
- Jenn Loeswick, Preschool Director reports the February Art Walk (artwork hanging in Fellowship Hall) was a big success and enjoyed by all. She is enjoying more family participation in the classes. They are having a coin drive for St. Patrick's Day. The money will be used to buy more books for the classrooms. Soccer Stars ends next week and will start again in the fall. The Preschool Egg Hunt is scheduled for March 28, the last day before Spring Break. Lots of work is being put into the Auction Fundraiser scheduled for April. A grant application with the Chapin Foundation has been submitted to assist with the playground renovation.

Ratify Email Votes from the Month: None.

Items for Discussion/Approval:

- Capital Campaign updates: Building/Renovation Meeting held March 3 was well attended and many questions answered. Volunteers signed up for the Liturgical Furniture Team (first meeting March 13) and the Aesthetics Enhancement Committee (meet at a future date). Parking lot approval continues to be held up by DHEC. Earthworks is in communication with the City of Myrtle Beach and DHEC. Linda Prochaska (Finance Committee) is exploring options of using Mission Investment Funds versus First Citizens Bank for future money needs.
- Micheal Kohn contract is pending approval. Current fee is 6% of the projected budget. Congregational approval
 needed for Council to sign the contract. A special congregational meeting suggested for April 7, 2024, between
 services for Organ purchase approval. Request made to include Architectural Design Contract approval to be
 included at congregational meeting.
- Endowment committee recommendations and explanations submitted to council for review and approval. The higher education scholarship to be set at \$1000 a year, instead of varying amount based on market and number of applicants. It is felt to be fair amount and one that could be sustained through 2032. Pause the withdrawal of higher education portion until there is a qualified applicant. The non-withdrawn portion will remain in the fund with an accounting of the amount to be used for future applicants. Limit preschool scholarships to no more than 1/3 of the required withdrawal. To continue to review the scholarship amounts and splits between higher education and preschool. Council vote to accept the Endowment Committee recommendations passed unanimously.

Leadership Development/Lord's Prayer

Dismissal: Motion was made by Glenn Stef and seconded by Jim Seidel to adjourn the meeting at 7:50 p.m. Motion passed unanimously. The next Regular Meeting of the Council is scheduled for Tuesday, April 9, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.


MUSIC NOTES with John

Welcome Spring from the WELCA Circles Esther Circle Leader, Elsie Angus & Ruth Circle Leader, Barbara Miller



January started out with the Esther Circle undecorating the Chrismon tree and in February, cleaning the sanctuary. We assembled 216 Period Packets for the Operations Director in the Midland area. Thank you to the Esther ladies for your help!

220 packs of crackers were Esther's food collection for February and donated to the Help 4 Kids Backpack Buddies program.

An interesting veteran volunteer presentation was given by Barbara Boord at the meeting. Ruth Circle has a new leader, Barbara Miller. Thank you for stepping up!

The first Sunday of March was celebrated as Bold Women Sunday. Six women, 90+ years young and longtime members of St Philip, were highlighted on the WELCA

bulletin board. 25 packages of cookies were donated as evening snacks for a group of 25 adults and school students, from Cambridge, New York, who spend their Easter vacation repairing homes and trying to better the lives of the children that Help 4 Kids serve. At the March meeting of the Esther Circle, the ladies assembled 433 youth and 20 adult Period Packets for distribution in Horry County. Both Circles filled 6 Easter baskets each for the Meals on Wheels of Horry County "Grandparents" and donated 80 nonperishable food items as well.
