St. Philip Faith Stories: "Full-Circle" - Jeff Church

"There were things I learned as a kid that no one thought were sinking in - but they did!" Jeff Church's childhood involved regular worship attendance with his grandmother. It wasn't always something he wanted to do, but as part of the family, church attendance was very much expected. Despite that, it was in church - particularly when he started to meet some of his peers who became friends - that he started to grow in his faith.

"It became about relationship and friendship," Jeff reflected. "I attended Bible school, but it was the friendships that led me to come back." Thanks to being in church, Jeff discovered a relationship with God through relationships with others. "God is here and God is there, and I feel I can worship anywhere." But



Jeff also knows that being part of a faith community is important - especially for his two daughters. So, the Church family set out to find a faith community where their daughters could feel connected. "We were looking for the type of fellowship that I grew up in, that made an impression on me," he expressed.

And that is precisely what Jeff and his family found at St. Philip. When Jeff and his family arrived, they were confident the church was committed to educating and involving children. They witnessed kids and youth learning about God through youth events, children's choir, church camps, and more. "Those were things we were looking for and things that St. Philip supports. Our kids can connect in different ways."

Jeff feels comfortable that he can pass along to his daughters what his family passed on to him: an experience of the Christian faith in ways they will remember for a lifetime. "It is so beneficial for our children. They get to build this wonderful thing; the kids get to experience God with their peers."

Now, Jeff eagerly anticipates his daughters' ongoing journey in faith and looks forward to the ways he can be meaningfully involved. His excitement extends to his family's contributions to the Forward Together capital campaign. In a poignant full-circle moment, Jeff found himself contributing an unexpected family gift that was passed on to him. It's a concrete expression of the legacy of faith that spans generations.

As St. Philip continues to cultivate connections, educate the youth, and uphold the values that resonated with Jeff in his younger days, the story of faith carries on - passed along in ways we trust will sink in, and because of God, they certainly will.

ST. PHILIP LUTHERAN CHURCH REGULAR MEETING OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL

January 16, 2024 Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the St. Philip Lutheran Church Council was held on Tuesday, January 16, 2024, in the Conference Room.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Council President, Dave Witmer. A quorum was present to conduct business.

Council Members present: Pastor Jason Lee, Dave Witmer, Susan McClelland, Linda Albert, Glenn Stef, Jackie Orcutt, Jim Seidel, Roz Hanlon, and Shauna Shea. Others present: Jenn Loeswick (Preschool Director). Council Members not present: Ronda Anderson. Others not present: John Sparkman (Director of Music Ministry).

Opening Devotions and Discussion: Pastor Jason read a passage from Mark 5 and led a discussion related to Jesus making changes/transformations and how it relates to us.

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made by Glenn Stef and seconded by Jim Seidel to approve the Council Minutes dated December 12, 2023. Motion passed unanimously.

Finance Reports: The reports were presented by Linda Albert for information purposes only and were accepted as presented.

Committee Reports:

- Music and Worship Committee meeting minutes from January 2, 2024 were reviewed.
- Property Committee report submitted by Dave Ramsey and presented by Pastor Jason Lee. Bids for contractors for the parking lot will begin soon as plans are in the final stages.
- Fellowship Committee meeting minutes from January 8, 2024 were reviewed.
- Youth Committee: events are planned for January 20, 2024 (Saturday morning breakfast and movie), February 11, 2024 (after church lunch and activity), and March 23, 2024 (Easter egg hunt and activities). Older youth Sunday School continues to be well attended.
- Finance Committee is scheduled to meet on January 23, 2024.
- Outreach Committee homeless meal planned for January 27, 2024.

Staff Reports:

- Pastor's report submitted for January 2024 by Pastor Jason. Highlights include: Christmas Eve services were well attended with 300+ attendance combined. The Holden Evening Prayer services went very well with good attendance. John Sparkman and Pastor Jason are working on plans for Lent. There is an increase in homebound visits. Starting in Lent, communion will switch to intinction. There will be information and announcements to help prepare the congregation for this change. Ash Wednesday services are scheduled for Wednesday, February 14, at 12:15 and 6:00 p.m.. Lenten meals and worship will also be starting back. Parking lot plans are moving slowly.
- Jenn Loeswick, Preschool Director: The preschool is getting back into regular routine after returning from the break. Preparations have started for the online auction fundraiser in April. Two new students are joining the preschool in January. Jenn is interested in a class (online and in-person) to work towards a nature-based teacher certification.

Ratify Email Votes from the Month: None

Items for Discussion/Approval: Dave Witmer updated that we are all set with American Church Group (Brotherhood Mutual) insurance. Membership lists are being researched and reviewed to identify inactive members (per Bylaws defined as someone who has not communed and contributed in the preceding calendar year). Currently 4 individuals and one couple are identified. A letter will be mailed to them confirming intent for inactive status.

Leadership Development: Pastor and Council discussed the article "Leadership and Church Size Dynamics: How Strategy Changes with Growth" by Dr. Timothy Keller. This ties into Pastor's sabbatical studying and coaching for size transitions. Plans are being finalized for Pastoral coverage during sabbatical and processes are being reviewed to ensure seamless coverage of Pastor Jason's responsibilities and duties. Shanna Cisson (Chair Sabbatical Committee) will be meeting with council to facilitate the process.

Lord's Prayer

Dismissal: Motion was made by Susan McClelland and seconded by Glenn Steff to adjourn the meeting at 7:41 p.m. Motion passed unanimously. The next Regular Meeting of the Council is scheduled for Tuesday, February 13, 2024 at 6:00 p.m.

Communion Distribution during the Season of Lent

Each Sunday we gather for Word and Sacrament - hearing the word of God proclaimed and sharing in the Lord's Supper. In Holy Communion, we are sustained, nourished, and strengthened to live out our call of witness and service in the world. Communion is central to our worship service.



Beginning on Ash Wednesday and continuing through the Sundays in Lent, we will transition to distributing communion by intinction. Intinction involves dipping the consecrated bread (wafer) into the chalice of wine and then eating. We will continue to come forward to the head of the aisle for distribution. We will receive the wafer from the pastor and move to the chalice of wine, dipping the wafer. Be mindful not to submerge your fingers. If you accidentally put the wafer in your mouth, the pastor will offer another wafer to you. The pastor will still have gluten-free wafers and packets of grape juice, should that be your preference.


There are many reasons for this change. Theologically, this method of distribution better symbolizes the unity we have in Christ. As individual members of the body of Christ partake from the one cup, it visually represents the idea that all of us, though diverse, are included, equal, and part of the one body of Christ. There is one Bread, one Vine, and one Body of Christ.

On the practical side, this method of distribution ensures we are good stewards of what God has given. Plastic waste will be eliminated. This is a more economical use of wine, limiting the unused leftovers. It saves the Altar Guild much time filling up one cup instead of 160 cups (or more). In embracing this method of Communion distribution, we look forward to a season of deeper reflection, unity in Christ, and responsible stewardship, as we continue to gather around the one Bread and one Cup as the one Body of Christ.

Sabbatical Reminders and Updates

In the summer of 2024 (June 1-September 15), Pastor Jason and family will be taking a sabbatical.

A "sabbatical" is a significant amount of time away from ministry responsibilities and is to be used for both professional growth and personal renewal. A sabbatical intends to sharpen the recipient's skills and to refresh both the spiritual life and a sense of calling. A Sabbatical is not an additional vacation.



Sabbaticals, unlike vacations, assume that the congregational council and the synod play a significant role with the rostered minister in the planning, execution, and evaluation in shaping the outcome. There will be learning and growing that occurs, both for Pastor Jason and for the congregation of St. Philip.

Over the coming months, more detailed plans will be shared, including an overview of what Pastor Jason will be studying while away, who will be our interim pastor during that time, and other answers to questions we all may have. If there are other questions, please speak to Pastor Jason or any member of the Sabbatical Committee: Dick Albert, Shanna Cisson, and Jim Eubanks.

Mission & Outreach Committee Meeting Highlights January 8, 2024

Feeding the Homeless: Patrick reported in January we will be serving Chili and Baked Potato; in February we will be serving Chicken Pot Pie and Salad; and in March we will be serving Pizza. We are looking for another driver for van pickup. Discussed checking with Food Lion for boxed meals which they offer at a discount at the end of the year.

Blessing Box: Roz reported that supply closet is filled. Discussed schedule for filling the Blessing Box. All of us will check when we are at various meetings at church to see if box needs filling.

Mobile Meals: Audrey reported they are now serving 40-45 people. They received \$1,080 from the Chapin Foundation which celebrated their 80th anniversary. St. Philip also received \$1,080 from the Chapin Foundation celebrating their 80th anniversary.

Meals on Wheels: Barb reported they are still searching for a building. Frozen meals are being supplied. Everything is in storage for now.

Helping Hands: Barb reported that a total of 1,517.6 lbs. of food was given from St. Philip to Helping Hands in 2023. Souper Bowl of Caring will be held on February 11 (Super Bowl Sunday). Collection of food will take place and "soup pots" will be available for monetary donations. Barb will contact Executive Director, Tony Gardner, to learn of any specific pantry needs.

New American Program: Barbara reported that over 400 items were collected for the Coat Collections. Items included coats, blankets, hats, etc.

Reading Buddies at Myrtle Beach Primary and Boys and Girls Club: Gail reported that Kim Thomas of Myrtle Beach Primary is the contact for Reading Buddies Program. They are ready for reading buddies. Volunteers must complete online background check form. Gail reported that Karen Vassell is the new CEO of the Boys and Girls Club. Changes have been made to improve tutoring areas. They are also ready for volunteer tutors.

Benevolence: Don led discussion on current benevolences (Helping Hand of Myrtle Beach, Help 4 Kids, Lutheran World Relief, and Boys and Girls Club). Current benevolences distributed for 2023 were \$17,671.63. ACI Benevolence Funds distributed totaled \$5,724.47. Benevolence Gift to SC Synod -ELCA totaled \$8,589.00. Total benevolences distributed for 2023 of \$31,976.10.

Committee discussed current benevolences. A motion was made by Shanna Cisson and seconded by Roz Hanlon to switch Lutheran World Relief to Lutheridge for 2024. Motion passed. Further discussion will be held at a later date regarding Christmas in July selection.

Pastor Jason led discussion regarding other outreach activities to get involved in besides Feeding the Homeless. Patrick and Shanna will meet separately to brainstorm different activities. It was suggested that we try to do something once a quarter to start.

MUSIC NOTES with John

"In him there is no darkness at all, the night and the day are both alike!"

Throughout this season following Epiphany, we've been celebrating the light of Christ shining from the manger into all the world. One of the ways we've expressed this in worship has been to sing Kathleen Thomason's moving hymn "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light" each week as we share Holy Communion as a community. This hymn communicates deep conviction and personal sincerity, while avoiding any pretense. The first person writing invites all those singing to join Jesus, the Light of the World, in discipleship—our lifelong journey of faith. The second line of each verse deepens this commitment:

Verse 1: "I want to follow Jesus."

Verse 2: "I want to look at Jesus."

Verse 3: "I want to be with Jesus"

But it is the refrain that carries the essence of the hymn's meaning, with its scriptural allusions that quote from Revelation 21 and 22 that distinguishes this hymn from many earlier expressions of discipleship.

The simplicity of the music and text does not imply a simplistic faith, however. "I Want to Walk as a Child" reminds us of one of the central paradoxes of our faith, that in following Jesus we become as a child to fully appreciate and understand the depth and mystery of the kingdom of God.

As the weeks of Epiphany come to a close, I hope you'll join in worship to sing this and many other great hymns of our faith, and to hear the joyful music St Philip's musicians of all ages have prepared to help us turn from the shadows around us, looking instead towards the light of Christ everywhere our journeys lead us.
