REGULAR MEETING OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL

December 12, 2023 Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the St. Philip Lutheran Church Council was held on Tuesday, December 12, 2023, in the Conference Room.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:04 p.m. by Council President, Dave Witmer. A quorum was present to conduct business.

Council Members present: Pastor Jason Lee, Ronda Anderson, Roz Hanlon, Susan McClelland, Jackie Orcutt, Jim Seidel, Glenn Stef, Dave Witmer, Shauna Shea. Others present: John Sparkman (Director of Music Ministry), Jenn Loeswick (Preschool Director). Council Members not present: Linda Albert.

Opening Devotions and Discussion: Pastor Jason asked council to reflect and discuss their favorite Christmas Carol/ Hymn and why it has meaning to them. Pastor led a discussion on these favorite hymns and how it relates to God's guidance/grandeur/presence in our lives.

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made by Susan McClelland and seconded by Ronda Anderson to approve the Council Minutes dated November 14, 2023. Motion passed unanimously.

Finance Reports: The Financial Reports were presented by Pastor Jason Lee on behalf of Linda Albert for information purposes only and were accepted as presented.

Committee Reports: Music and Worship Committee meeting report of November 28, 2023. Property Committee report submitted by Dave Ramsey and presented by Pastor Jason Lee. Bids for contractors for the parking lot will begin soon as plans are in the final stages.

Staff Reports: John Sparkman, Director of Music Ministry

John reported that worship services have good energy and Holden Evening Prayer on Wednesdays are well attended. He has met with the organ rep and plans are progressing regarding upcoming renovations and organ purchase. Both pianos (sanctuary and choir room) have received maintenance and tuning. A heater and dehumidifier have been installed in the grand piano. Heavy duty casters will be installed on the grand piano to make it easier to move around and position appropriately. Choir practices are well attended. Bell choir practices are going well. Christmas Eve services will include Festive Brass with Jim Seidel and Violin by Redding Soderberg to enhance worship.

Pastor's Report, November 2023 submitted by Pastor Jason.

Pastor Jason highlighted financial preparation for sabbatical and capital campaign are moving forward as planned. There will be many leadership and development projects in the upcoming year. Pastor also reported the Chapin Foundation hosted an event to celebrate it's 80th Anniversary. It was informative and well attended. All attendees will receive a \$1080 donation.

Jenn Loeswick, Preschool Director

The December Preschool Newsletter was reviewed. Jenn has started using the Homeroom App to improve communication with parents (all classes). She has been exploring ways to help parents recognize appropriate milestones, expectations, and goals with the kids. The Veterans Day program was successful. The preschool's Christmas Program will be held on Friday December 15 at 9:30 a.m. (last day of school before break). School will start back on Tuesday, January 2, 2024. Currently, there are 34 students enrolled (4's – 10; 3's – 8; 2's – 16). Fundraising has been going well, popcorn sale (\$600) and Sky Zone (\$146). The preschool is set to get relicensed next fall.

Items for Discussion/Approval: Dave Witmer updated that we are waiting on a binder from American Church Group Brotherhood Mutual before canceling insurance coverage with Church Mutual.

Roz Hanlon reported that the Blessing Box needs some reorganizing and a new scheduling system for filling. She will work with Outreach Committee to get this done.

Executive Session: Council went into executive session to discuss monetary gifts for church and preschool staff members.

Dismissal: Motion was made by Susan McClelland and seconded by Glenn Steff to adjourn the meeting at 7:45 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.






Many hands helped decorate the sanctuary for Christmas. Thanks to all who were able to help!
