

ST. PHILIP LUTHERAN CHURCH REGULAR MEETING OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL

February 13, 2024 Meeting Minutes

The regular meeting of the St. Philip Church Council was held on Tuesday, February 13, 2024, in the conference room.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Council Vice-President Susan McClelland. A quorum was present to conduct business.

Council Members Present: Susan McClelland, Linda Albert, Glen Stef, Jackie Orcutt, Ronda Anderson, Jim Seidel, Pastor Jason Lee, Shauna Shea. Others Present: John Sparkman (Director of Music Ministry), Shanna Cisson (Sabbatical Committee). Council Members not present: Roz Hanlon. Others not present: Jenn Loeswick (Preschool Director)

Opening Devotions and Discussion: Pastor led devotions discussing the meaning of Mardi Gras/Shrove Tuesday/Fat Tuesday and read from the book 'Children's Letters to God'.

Leadership Development: Shanna Cisson was present to provide council with a sabbatical update. Beth Neubauer has agreed to be Interim Pastor during sabbatical. She will begin her contract on May 26, 2024 (Installation of Interim Pastor) and Pastor Jason's sabbatical begins on June 1, 2024. Pastor Beth will have office hours Mondays, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., attend council meetings, do visitations and other pastoral duties as needed. Estimated time commitment of 10 hours per week. Council members were given information sheets to fill out (for reference during sabbatical). They will be returned to Shauna when completed.

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made by Glen Stef and seconded by Jim Seidel to approve the Council Minutes dated January 16, 2024. Motion passed unanimously.

Finance Reports: The Reports were presented by Linda Albert for information purposes only and were accepted as presented.

Committee Reports Presented: Fellowship Committee meeting minutes from February 5, 2024; Worship and Music Committee meeting minutes from February 6, 2024; Veiling of the cross will occur during Lent after research and presentation by John Iredell; Property Report from Dave Ramsey. Pastor continues to work with City and Consultant to finalize permit application and solicit plans for contractor bids for dirt parking lot project. New caulking applied to windows along 63rd Ave. nearest Fellowship Hall (thanks to John Angus and Phil Wolfe).

Staff Reports:

- John Sparkman, Director of Music Ministry: Handbells 101 is complete and went well. Handbell choir is playing 3 octaves. Choir practices/performances are going well. Children's choir ministry is presenting scheduling challenges.
- Jenn Loeswick, Preschool Director presented by Pastor Jason. Looking into a Chapin Foundation Grant for new playground equipment. Letter of inquiry deadline of April 1.
- Pastor's Report February 2024: A new oven/cooktop has been installed in the fellowship hall kitchen gifted by AJ Perez. Moe's restaurant employees are currently parking in the church parking lot. Will monitor to see if this causes or becomes a problem. Monday February 12 the fire department showed up at church because of a triggered alarm (no visible alarm or fire). Upon investigation a mouse had gained access to the control panel in the electrical closet and that triggered the alarm. March 3 is a Capital Campaign update after the 10:30 a.m. service to review the sanctuary renovation plans.

Ratify Email Votes from the Month: None

Items for Discussion/Approval: Council is responsible for Lenten Meal on March 6. A signup sheet was passed around. The Michael Kohn Architect Agreement was reviewed and discussed. Questions arose. Pastor will reach out to Michael Kohn for clarification and report back to council.

Dismissal: A motion was made by Glen Stef and seconded by Jim Seidel to adjourn the meeting at 8:16 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.

Communion Distribution during the Season of Lent

Each Sunday we gather for Word and Sacrament - hearing the word of God proclaimed and sharing in the Lord's Supper. In Holy Communion, we are sustained, nourished, and strengthened to live out our call of witness and service in the world. Communion is central to our worship service.



Continuing through the Sundays in Lent, we will transition to distributing communion by intinction. Intinction involves dipping the consecrated bread (wafer) into the chalice of wine and then eating. We will continue to come forward to the head of the aisle for distribution. We will receive the wafer from the pastor and move to the chalice of wine, dipping the wafer. Be mindful not to submerge your fingers. If you accidentally put the wafer in your mouth, the pastor will offer another wafer to you. The pastor will still have gluten free wafers and packets of grape juice, should that be your preference.

There are many reasons for this change. Theologically, this method of distribution better symbolizes the unity we have in Christ. As individual members of the body of Christ partake from the one cup, it visually represents the idea that all of us, though diverse, are included, equal, and part of the one body of Christ. There is one Bread, one Vine, and one Body of Christ.

On the practical side, this method of distribution ensures we are good stewards of what God has given. Plastic waste will be eliminated. This is a more economical use of wine, limiting the unused leftovers. It saves the Altar Guild much time filling up one cup instead of 160 cups (or more). In embracing this method of Communion distribution, we look forward to a season of deeper reflection, unity in Christ, and responsible stewardship, as we continue to gather around the one Bread and one Cup as the one Body of Christ.

Sabbatical Updates: Learning and Growth Engagement

"What would we need to change to integrate the next 50 people God wants to send us?" That question will guide Pastor Jason's study while he is on sabbatical from June 1 to September 15, 2024.

A mission field is rising around St. Philip as a church located in the numerically growing Myrtle Beach area. We continue to grow in mission and



ministry, and because of that, we are also growing in number. Numerical growth raises questions for those who already are the people of St. Philip Lutheran Church. When pastors and churches proactively address and resolve these questions, they position themselves to answer the above question with health and intention. When they leave the answers to chance, they often self-sabotage their growth.

Because of this, Pastor Jason will be working with Pinnacle Leadership Associates over the summer to proactively navigate St. Philip's growth into the future. The Learning will involve Leadership Coaching for Pastor Jason. One-to-one leadership coaching provides the opportunity to engage with a knowledgeable conversation partner, integrating learning from book studies, congregational inventories, and the development of a Leadership Profile, which includes assets and growing edges.

The ultimate goal of this Learning is, along with leadership at St. Philip, to develop a church-specific size transition plan. After the plan is created and approved by the Council, then the work of church leadership and the congregation shifts toward implementation. Please pray for Pastor Jason and St. Philip during this sabbatical time, that it may lead to renewal, revitalization, and preparedness for the future.

MUSIC NOTES with John

The St. Philip Organ Committee has been working hard behind the scenes since my arrival in November to make an educated choice on which instrument will next lead the worship of St. Philip.

In late November, the committee travelled to Charleston to meet with a representative of Allen Organ company and to visit several installations of their instruments in the area. Then in early January, the committee met with a representative of Rodgers Organs, the manufacturer of our current instrument. After traveling from Maryland to visit with us, he facilitated a visit of a Rodgers instrument in Conway.

Unanimously in February, the Committee voted to recommend that the St. Philip community move forward with the Allen Organ company, whose comprehensive factory in Pennsylvania produces the largest number of organs in the US, and whose local SC service representative is close to us. After discussion and deliberation, we found that the craftsmanship, true-to-pipe sound, service availability, and warranty of Allen instruments matched our desire for a vibrant and reliable instrument to inspire congregational singing and to lead the community's music and worship forward.

The instrument we are recommending is a two-keyboard, 47-stop instrument with a compact style terraced console, with much of its looks modeled on the console (pictured). This "French-style" console has a lower profile, which will help with sight lines when conducting and leading worship while playing - especially for someone of my stature - plus it will be a design unique in our area. The instrument's digitally reproduced sounds will include hundreds of thousands of sampled, live recordings of individual pipes of organs from around the world, rather than the synthesized,

analog sounds which comprise the bulk of our current instrument. The console's lighter wood finishes in maple and oak, along with its primary stoplist, are inspired by Northern European instruments in Germany and Scandinavia, and reflect our over-arching desire to lighten and brighten our beach-adjacent sanctuary.



Speaking of pipes, I am very excited that we will reposition all of our current beautiful visible pipes in our new instrument's facade flanking the new focal point of our worship space, the large Christ the Victor window. We anticipate that the silver of most of the pipe work will catch and diffuse light from the window into the nave in quite a dazzling way, with our larger, flamed copper pipes pictured up close below - forming the outer portions of the facade, once the dust has been shaken off, of course. It is going to be a very beautiful instrument both visually and aurally, as pipework - like our voices and hands - lift towards Christ in praise, one that will inspire generations to come at St. Philip.

I welcome your questions on the committee's instrument recommendation at any time, and hope that you will join us on March 3rd as we discuss renovation plans following 10:30 worship. See you there!
