

Lutheran Services Carolinas Dedicates Space in Myrtle Beach

Prayers and blessings abounded, donations presented, the blue ribbon was cut, and the door was opened to the office of the New Americans Program!

On a rainy, windy, and chilly Sunday afternoon in Myrtle Beach, the Rev. Virginia (Ginny) S. Aebischer, Bishop of the SC Synod of the ELCA; Pastors Jason Lee, St. Philip Lutheran Church, and Brad Bellah, Shephard of the Sea Lutheran Church; along with Ted W. Goins, Jr., LSC President, spoke to a crowd of 30+ people gathered to celebrate the Lutheran Services Carolinas New Americans program. Mr. Goins introduced the staff of the program and thanked all who helped open the doors at another office for this program. Pastor Lee offered an opening prayer to bless its efforts today and for its future success. Pastor Bellah presented a check for \$17,000 representing donations collected in support of this program. Bishop Ginny Aebischer spoke of the importance of this program, the needs of so many refugees, and the hope that many will answer the call to help.

The program works closely with Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service and local faith organizations, to welcome refugees and immigrants, and LSC helps them transition into a new life and a new culture. Volunteers who provide welcome, friendship, and practical support are vital in assisting New Americans as they work to achieve self-sufficiency and integration. Interested faith partners and community groups can also engage as a Circle of Welcome, which is a program for faith and community groups to make a meaningful commitment to walk alongside a refugee family as they begin their new life in our communities. It is a partnership between the family, Lutheran Services, and the Circle of Welcome team.

St. Philip will host an information / volunteer training session on Thursday, April 20, 5:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Anyone that is interested in learning more about the program is welcome to join the meeting hosted by Jodie Shuster, Resettlement Director, New Americans Program. 


- General Help A generally handy person who can change light bulbs, do some touchup painting, give help with moving things, and so forth.

Highlights from the March 20, 2023, meeting of Mission & Outreach

Don Letourneau called the meeting to order, and Pastor Jason opened with a prayer.

Lutheran World Relief

Motion was made by Gail and seconded by Shanna to forward \$500 to Lutheran Services Carolina for the New American Program, and \$500 to Lutheran World Relief for disaster relief from the earthquake in Turkey, using carryover funds from the 2022 Endowment. All agreed. Gail will check with Linda Albert and Linda Prochaska regarding how much and when 2023 endowment funds will be available.

Benevolence for January and February 2023

Don shared an email from Linda Albert regarding (i) checks written on March 15 to our benevolences as follows: \$2,725.89/Helping Hand; \$198.75/Help4Kids; \$218.75/LWR; \$198.75/Boys & Girls Club; and \$20.00/Meals on Wheels; (ii) Homeless Ministry fund balance as of March 19 is \$612.48; and (iii) remaining endowment balance for 2022 is \$1,124.47.





