

#### Items for Discussion/Approval:

Capital Campaign Budget: Pastor Jason reviewed the capital campaign budget, which totals \$11,800. Discussion was had surrounding how we best proceed with sourcing funding for the capital campaign and the first payment of architectural fees.

A motion was made by Dave Whitmer and seconded by Glenn Stef that we use council designated cash to pay for the architectural fees and cover the cost of the capital campaign budget, while in 2023, \$30,000 will be transferred from the Long-Range Planning Fund to recoup money that was expended and replenish the account. Motion passed unanimously.

There being no further business to discuss, motion was made by Glenn Stef and seconded by Shauna Shea to adjourn meeting at 7:27 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.

#### Swept-Up - Roz Hanlon

Raising a family in a Jewish home has a lot of traditions to follow – separate dishes for different celebrations, walking to places, and no outside activities on the Sabbath – to name a few. It can seem quite strict and difficult to keep up with. That's how Roselyn (Roz) Hanlon felt in 1995 when she and her daughter, Shelby, moved to Myrtle Beach from Media, PA, and they started attending the local Chabad Synagogue. Roz was raised in the Jewish faith, but she did not have a role model to call on. She did know that following the Jewish law and practices was not going to work for her at that time in her life.

Roz married Tommy on January 1, 1996. He introduced Roz to the church he was attending, St. Philip Lutheran. "My daughter Shelby and I were immediately swept-up and put to ease by the Pastor," Roz shared. Soon they were both baptized. The whole family immersed themselves in the church - Tommy as the choir director, Roz taught children the Old Testament, and Shelby joined the Girl Scout troop who met at the church. Roz started working with the youth group and the leaders, and she volunteered with the VBS programs. "The church is the people," Roz said. Jackie Orcutt meant a lot to Roz. She met Jackie while standing in line at a school function and started talking to her about St. Philip. Jackie and her family soon joined the church and Roz was Jackie's sponsor. Roz said, "with everything Jackie's been through, she never lost her faith." Without saying it, Jackie has been a role model for Roz.

Roz has met a lot of people through the church, and some have been a big influence in her Christian life. She is grateful for the way she and Shelby were put at ease and how it has remained a place of faith she supports with joy and can call home.

#### **Structure - Terry Harter**

Terry Harter grew up in Lutheran churches all over the world. While most of those churches were in New York, Terry's faith was fed in places like Germany, the UK, and Australia. All through life, in the ups and downs, faith gave him structure. "Faith guided me," Terry says.

When he moved to Myrtle Beach, Terry tried several churches - even non-Lutheran denominations. "I was looking for something that felt like home," he shared. But the other churches didn't quite give him that feeling. Something was missing.

Terry's first worship experience at St. Philip Lutheran Church was on Christmas Eve of 2021. "And at St. Philip, it was like coming home,"



Terry said.. "The liturgy, the service itself, the whole package." Even beyond worship, Terry feels he can live out his life-long faith through the variety of ministries St. Philip offers. "I have the opportunity to make a difference," Terry says. "I love that. It's very important to me."

Now, Terry is involved in many ministries that make a difference in our local community in tangible ways. He has given to Christmas in July, brought in school supplies, and regularly contributes to St. Philip's monthly meals for the homeless. "If I'm going to give, I want it to have meaning. I like to help the community we're in; that's part of the mission."

Terry attends St. Philip because it is a home that nourishes his faith in multiple ways. At St. Philip, Terry found - through quality worship services, through tangible ways to serve, and offering many levels multiple ways to live out one's his faith - across the world, and right here at home.


