

Meeting Minutes May 23, 2023

During the meeting held on May 23, 2023, the following items were discussed:

Benevolence Funds:

Don indicated the 2022 balance was \$1,124.47. It was determined that \$500 would be donated to Lutheran Services Carolinas for their New Americans Program, and \$500 would be donated to Lutheran World Relief for their efforts to help those in Turkey. The remaining balance will be added to the 2023 funds of \$4,724.

Helping Hands:

Barb Poloni discussed the collections for Helping Hands should consist of non-perishable items. Donations will be delivered to the facility on 10th Avenue during the week of June 5th by Don Letourneau, John Angus, and Jack Ledford.

LSC – Lutheran Services Carolinas:

Shanna Cisson reported there was a meeting held on April 20 – several members of the congregation and from the community met with Rev. Jodie Shuster to learn how the program of 'Circle of Welcome' for refugees is set-up in this area. The next step is to have a training meeting of the volunteers which will be scheduled soon.

Boys and Girls Club of Myrtle Beach (www.bgclubgs.org):

Gail Kane indicated that she and Linda Albert have been tutoring children since April and will end when school closes for the summer. There are other options to help the children during the summer months with field trips, etc. During the month of June, we will be collecting supplies for the Boys and Girls – a list of needed supplies will be provided.

Christmas in July:

Don indicated "Christmas in July" will be the same as last year beginning on July 9 with weekly collections through July 30. A "noisy" offering will be dedicated on Sunday, July 30. Donations will go to the Waccamaw Youth Center, Lutheran Services Carolinas – Youth Group, and Churches Assisting People (CAP) of Conway. Representatives from each organization will be invited to receive a check during the 10:30 a.m. service on Sunday, August 13, 2023.

Feeding the Homeless:

We are scheduled to feed the guests on Saturday, May 27, 2023. The meal will be chicken and rice casseroles, salad, and desserts. The next feeding is scheduled for Saturday, June 24, 2023.

Blessina Box

The Blessing Box door was repaired recently. Don indicated he has spoken to a few different managers at the Food Lion across the street about making donations. There is a mission box set-up to collect non-perishable donations.

Back-Pack Buddies:

Back-to-school supplies will be collected during August. A mission box will be set up and a list of items needed will be provided. "Tax Free" weekend is August 5 and 6, 2023.

God's Work – Our Hands:

Save the Date - Sunday, September 10, 2023, a meal to honor First Responders will be provided.

Lunch Bunch:

The group will not meet during the summer months – they will resume in September.

St. Philip Faith Stories "PATH OF PEACE" - Judy Ombrello

Judy Ombrello grew up in the Midwest of our country. As a young girl growing up, she did not have much of a church background. Later on, adjusting to life as a single mom did not afford her the time or energy to settle into church life. But then, a man named Joe stepped into her life, and she was drawn in a completely different and faith-filled direction.

Joe became her soul mate, her confidant, and her partner in a journey of faith. They began going to a Lutheran church, attending weekly. Because music was so important to Joe, music also became a big part of Judy's life. She began playing in the handbell choir at church, finding much joy in ringing.

But suddenly, Judy's world was turned upside down. Cancer quickly and unexpectedly took Joe's life. Judy

was lost and alone. It was then that Judy moved to Myrtle Beach and, because of some friends, found St. Philip Lutheran Church. She immediately felt the compassion and warmth of the congregation. The music connected deeply with her. Pastor Jason captured her need for faith. At her first worship service at St. Philip, Judy felt comfortable, at home, and as if Joe was right there with her. She knew God had led her to her new faith home.

Judy began to live out her love of music by playing in the St. Philip handbell choir – something she knows Joe would have loved. But more important than that, she found a place of peace, compassion, acceptance, and love. St. Philip is a place where Judy can feel connected to her husband, Joe, but also, it is a place where she knows she is cared for, uplifted, and trusts that God fills us again for our life of faith.
