The regular meeting of the St. Philip Lutheran Church Council was held on Tuesday, September 12, 2023.

Call to Order – Council Meeting: The meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Council President Dave Witmer. A quorum was present to conduct business. Pastor Jason announced Lauren Zuschlag's resignation from church council.

Opening devotions: Pastor led the council members through a devotional exercise focusing on the spiritual significance of waiting/stillness.

Constitutional Review: The proposed constitutional changes were sent to Synod for review. They came back with a few changes. The Constitution Committee reviewed them and made the changes. A motion was made by Shauna Shea and seconded by Jackie Orcutt to approve the constitution with the proposed changes. Plans are moving ahead for congregational review and voting (October and November). Two open forums to review and answer any questions will be on Tuesday September 19 at 11:00 am and again at 6:30 pm.

Finance Report: The reports were presented by Linda Albert for information purposes only and were accepted as presented.

Committee Reports: Council reviewed the Finance and Property Committee reports.

Staff Reports: Pastors report was submitted by Pastor Jason. Preschool report was submitted by Jenn Loeswick.

Ratify email votes from the month: Email voting was unanimous to approve the hiring of 2 preschool teachers.

Items for discussion/approval: Plans are moving forward for renovations. John Sparkman has reviewed the organ and renovation plans. He is scheduled to start November 12, 2023.

Leadership Development: Reviewed Pinnacle Leadership Associates Letter Sabbatical proposal program.

Dismissal: Motion made by Glenn Stef, second by Dave Witmer at 7:47 p.m. to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed unanimously.


