

Meeting Minutes

The Regular Meeting of the St. Philip Church Council was held on Tuesday, August 8, 2023, in the Conference Room.

Call to Order

The Meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Council President, Dave Witmer. A quorum was present to conduct business.

Opening Devotions:

Pastor Jason led devotions based on Matthew 14 and had small groups report on their discussions regarding ways that we can reach out to others, get to know each other better, and serve Jesus in our congregation.

Approval of Minutes:

Motion was made by Glenn Stef and seconded by Jim Seidel to approve the Council Minutes dated July 18, 2023. Motion passed unanimously.

The months of July and August offered worship services centered on *Christmas in July* and the season of Ordinary Time featuring our own liturgical dancers.

The summer season is over and the children are heading back to school with their backpacks blessed. Future plans for our Acolytes include a mini-golf tournament and a Retreat and cookout in October. Please continue to encourage and support our Acolytes.











Mission & Outreach Committee

The Mission & Outreach Committee met on Tuesday, August 22, 2023, 5:30 p.m. Those in attendance: Don Letourneau, Pastor Jason, Teddy Janosick, Barbara Miller, Barb Poloni, Gail Kane, Patrick Wilson, and Audrey McVean. Pastor Jason opened with prayer.

New American Program. We welcomed Barbara Miller to our committee. Barbara is the Outreach Coordinator for the New American Program with Lutheran Services Carolinas and a member of our congregation. Barbara provided info on forming a Circle of Welcome for refugee families coming to Myrtle Beach. A Circle of Welcome would guide the refugee family for the first six months to one year by assisting with locating housing, gathering furniture and clothing, providing meals upon arrival and stocking pantry when housing is obtained, driving to appointments, tutoring for English and cultural orientation. To introduce program to congregation, Barbara will provide info for bulletins and a coffee social was suggested. To raise funds, a noisy offering will be collected.

Christmas in July. Don reported that \$5,800 was collected this year with \$1,798 given to each organization.

"Gods Work/Our Hands" - September 10. Don reported that a \$250 community impact card from Thrivent will be used to purchase food. Sign up sheets in narthex. Men's Breakfast group will prepare hamburgers, hotdogs, and sides; Fellowship Committee will prepare desserts. First-responders will be invited as special guests.

Feeding the Homeless. Patrick reported that 25 guests were served in July with 20 to-go food boxes prepared. On August 26, we will be serving roast beef and fixings for lunch. In September, we will be serving two lunches - on the 23rd, the Youth Ministry will serve an Italian meal to include lasagna, spaghetti, etc. and on the 30th, a pulled pork and fixings lunch will be served. Patrick asked that diet sodas be removed from the list of items on the signup sheet. Signup sheets for the lunches in September will be posted online.

Blessing Box. Pastor Jason reported that Jenn Piccolo's husband repaired the damaged blessing box. Don asked that if any of us are at church for a meeting, etc., to check the box and restock as needed. Barbara Miller will provide a list of how long items are usable after expiration date.

Helping Hands. Barb Poloni contacted the executive director regarding pantry needs. She was advised that soup would be a great help for the upcoming fall/winter months. A soup drive will be held from September 3 - October 29 with mission boxes identified for all kind/brands of soups. Linda Hendricks has prepared a flyer to be posted

Meals on Wheels. Audrey reported that the organization has funds to last through December, 2023. It costs around \$5,000 - 6,000 monthly to provide meals. The meals are prepared by Senior Catering. Nine churches volunteer to deliver 35-40 meals a day. The Committee will consider donating extra funds at the end of the year. Audrey will write a letter to area churches regarding financial constraints and request assistance.

Boys and Girls Club. Gail has supplies provided by a congregation member to deliver. She will contact administrator to determine when tutors should return for this school year.

Reading Buddies. Gail will contact Michelle Greene Graham at Myrtle Beach Elementary School regarding status of reading buddy program.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday, September 19, 5:30 p.m.

"Host" - Patrick Wilson

After retiring from the restaurant business, Patrick Wilson decided to settle in Myrtle Beach. Before making the move, he and Tom felt the need to reconnect with their faith and attended a Catholic church. However, they never felt truly welcomed there. Once they moved to Myrtle Beach, they decided to try worshiping at a local church again, but unfortunately, the warm welcome they were hoping for still eluded them.

When Patrick and Tom found their way to St. Philip Lutheran Church in 2020, they were immediately embraced by a sense of belonging from the congregation. From the moment of their first visit, they were greeted by three different families, which left a lasting impression on Patrick. He found the worship experience at St. Philip to be deeply meaningful. The service's flow, the sermon, the music – all of it converged in a way that truly fostered an atmosphere of worship.
